2. ICWA was established for research, discussion and exchange of ideas on the issues of foreign policy and global affairs before our independence. A group of eminent intellectuals and leaders of the country including Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru, the first Prime Minister of India, provided crucial contributions for the establishment of the ICWA. With the status of an 'institution of national importance' bestowed on it by the Parliament of India, ICWA has been constantly engaged in fundamental research, academic interactions and outreach activities. Contemporary foreign policy themes are reflected in its work such as Delhi Dialogue, Conferences on India-Africa relations, Latin America and Caribbean Initiative and the Sapru House Lecture Series.

3. This lecture series is dedicated to the founding fathers of the ICWA. Since its inception in August 2012, eminent scholars and foreign dignitaries have delivered the lectures under this series. Today we are honored and privileged by the gracious presence of H.E. Prime Minister (Dr.) Viktor Orbán and look forward to his lecture.

4. It is a great honor for us that Smt. Preet Kaur, Minister of State for External Affairs, has accepted our invitation to give her special remarks. We are grateful to Ambassador S.K. It considers that a multi-polar world order is helpful for India-EU relations and it seeks to address the global challenges on the basis of effective multilateralism. As the world is moving fast on the swirling wave of globalization, our endeavors for free trade, scientific cooperation, peace and security are further strengthened. In the promotion of knowledge economy, India and Europe are significant partners.

6. A close and cordial relationship with Hungary has always been one of the important planks of India's policy towards Europe. Our countries share a multi-faceted partnership since the establishment of diplomatic relations in 1948. Both have striven for stable multi-polar global order. India-Hungary relations are widening in many realms, and our peoples take immense interest in the arts and culture of each other.

7. Both India and the EU have been experiencing transformation in their external policies today. We look forward to listening to the Prime Minister on the changing dynamics of European politics, economy and foreign policy.

8. H.E. (Dr.) Viktor Orbán has been the Prime Minister of Hungary since May 2010. He served in the same august position from 1998 to 2002. As Head of Government, he has been endeavoring to secure improvement in public health and education system in the country. His economic policy has been aimed at promoting inclusive development and economic growth. The
