



24th Sapru House Lecture, H.E. Dr. Abdullah Abdullah, Chief Executive of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan 29 September, 2017.

The 24th Sapru House lecture titled "Regional Peace Building" was delivered by H.E. Dr. Abdullah Abdullah, Chief Executive of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan. The session was chaired by the Foreign Secretary of India, Dr. S. Jaishankar. The welcome address was delivered by Ambassador Nalin Surie, DG, ICWA.

Dr. Abdullah Abdullah covered issues not only pertaining to the bilateral relations between India and Afghanistan, but also spoke about the other regional issues that have an impact on peace and stability in his country and the region. Talking about the strong bond of friendship between both the people, he said, India has contributed in the field of education, infrastructure creation, capacity building, construction of the Parliament House, and other areas including support to Afghanistan's security, inspiring democratic traditions for a better life for the people of Afghanistan. Referring to the recently unveiled US policy on Afghanistan and South Asia, Dr. Abdullah said, it has two sides i) efforts and aspirations of millions of people who

aspire for peaceful, stable, prosperous and democratic Afghanistan, ii) The sacrifices of Afghan people and the support of friendly countries, including India, that has enabled the people to pursue their goal.

Without naming countries backing terror in the region, Dr. Abdullah said, those supporting terror should not take pride. Welcoming South Asia policy of the US, which has regional aspects, the Afghan leader said that it has an impact on the Afghan situation as it is condition based which has removed uncertainty that was there earlier. Recognition of the rightful role of India as a global player and a preeminent economic player in the region provides opportunity for all.

Dr. Abdullah said, the challenges have been identified, but, denial is made which exacerbate the problem and complicates the situation and lead to sufferings in later stages. The other way is to identify the challenge and deal with it and show resolve in determination. Make a decision which you won't regret as consequences of it in future. Make a decision once and forever that terrorism will not be used as an instrument of pursuing foreign policy objectives. This is a fundamental question in this region and beyond.

As far as peace in Afghanistan is concerned, Afghanistan has legitimate right to defend its country and people, doors for negotiations are open. Hopefully, it will be materialised with the cooperation of all.

The lecture was followed by question and answer session. Dr. Abdullah came along with a delegation from Afghanistan, which included senior ministers and diplomats and members of the press and business community. The lecture was attended by diplomats, government officials, scholars and academicians and media personnel.

The Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA) hosted a talk by Hon. Patrick Pillay, Speaker of the National Assembly of Seychelles on “Cohabitation in Government – Importance of its Success”. He came with a parliamentary delegation from Seychelles. They were welcomed by Ambassador Shri Nalin Surie, Director General, Indian Council of World Affairs. He stated that India’s relations with Seychelles are extremely important and the subject chosen was one of great relevance not only in India but also in all political democracies.

Mr. Patrick Pillay, while delivering the talk said that even though Seychelles is small in population but not small in terms of its EEZ and in its ambition to succeed as modern democracy. While explaining about how the government works he said that certain aspect of the Constitution allows them to work through cohabitation, which is an agreement between the two entities. Executive head is the President who was elected by a popular vote. And in the National Assembly, majority are from the opposition.

He said that, they are ready to work together because they want to serve the country and people. He also said that, legislative, judiciary and executive are working together and respect independence of each other and responsibility, to ensure the governance is clean, accountable and transparent. He said these are the three guiding principles on which cohabitation is based. He said that, since the opposition is in majority in the house, it is instituting different investigations, and various committees constituted to rectify the injustices of the past.

They were accompanied by Mr Nguyen Khanh, First Secretary (Political), Vietnam Embassy, New Delhi and Dr. Sonu Trivedi, Zakir Hussain College, New Delhi.

They were greeted in the Council by Shri Piyush Srivastava, Joint Secretary, ICWA and Dr. Nivedita Ray, Director Research, along with Research Fellows Dr. Stuti Banerjee, Dr. Temjenmeren Ao, Dr. Dhruvajyoti Bhattacharjee and Dr. Avinash Godbole.

Joint Secretary Shri Piyush Srivastava stated about

the 45 years of India Vietnam relations, which has helped deepen people-to-people ties, and enhance economic integration. Both the countries have an ambitious agenda of joint cooperation in several areas. Though there are some problems in implementation, but both the governments are working actively to clear all roadblocks.

Prof. Mr. Le Van TOAN, Director (CIS) stated the need to raise the awareness on the India-Vietnam relations amongst the people in the government and the general masses, adapting relevant policies and cooperation programmes for realizing projects for making the relation more substantial. He said that there is a lack of focus in the implementation and operational level in the various policies adapted that is a major hurdle in India and Vietnam relations. He stressed the need to create centres in India for studying Vietnam and create more institutional connections. He showed his earnest eagerness to have an MoU with ICWA in the future.

Prof. David Arase, faculty of Hopkins-Nanjing Center, delivered a talk on China's Vision of an Asian Community of Common Destiny at ICWA, New Delhi. a. Lecture series: There were 9 lectures delivered by prominent experts in CASS. The lectures focused mostly on the overall China’s Economic Development, encompassing reform process, urbanization, climate change, financial system, and governance system. The main crux of the presentations was the illustration of the effectiveness and success of China’s development strategy. Most of the presentations were in Chinese.

b. Field studies: Apart from visits to different departments/centres and institutes of the CASS highlighting their evolution and achievements in terms of academic and intellectual excellence, a field visit to Shanghai – the financial capital was also conducted. The field visit included a tour to General Motors Corporation, Shanghai Yangshan Port (Shanghai Free Trade Zone) and Chongming Island Development Zone.

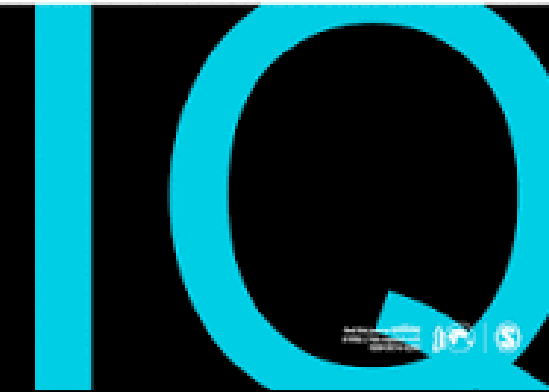
