



Third Track II Dialogue between India and New Zealand 23 April 2018 .

Indian Council of World Affairs welcomed a six member delegation from Asian New Zealand Foundation and New Zealand India Research Institution for the Third Track II Dialogue. The delegation comprised of Mr Simon Draper (Head of Delegation) Executive Director, Asia New Zealand Foundation, Professor Sekhar Bandyopadhyay, Director, New Zealand India Research Institute, Dr Kate McMillan, Victoria University of Wellington, Dr Manjeet Pardesi, Victoria University of Wellington, Dr James To, Asia New Zealand Foundation, and Mr Abbas Nazari, Asia New Zealand Foundation Leadership Network Member. The Dialogue focused on the need to strengthen relations between India and New Zealand. Issues such as closer economic cooperation, collaboration on climate change, renewable energy and maritime conservation were discussed along with the need to cooperate in the Indo-Pacific. Education and tourism were identified as sectors that need more support.

Talk by Shri V. Srinivas, IAS, Chairman Board of Revenue for Rajasthan & Chairman Rajasthan Tax Board on "The Rise of China in the International Monetary System" 27 April 2018



Shri V. Srinivas, IAS, Chairman Board of Revenue for Rajasthan & Chairman Rajasthan Tax Board delivered a talk on "The Rise of China in the International Monetary System" at Sapru House on April 27, 2018. The session was chaired by Ambassador Nalin Surie, DG, ICWA.

Shri Srinivas highlighted that economic growth model of China is based on high investment, inexpensive labour, productivity enhancing FDI and strong global demand. However, periods of cyclical surge in economic activities and high inflation are followed by periods of economic slowdown.

He explained that in 1996, RMB became convertible for current account transactions with People's Bank of China putting a limit of daily movement to ± 0.3 percent. China pursued a gradual approach to capital account liberalization given the weaknesses in the financial system. Full convertibility was the stated goal to be achieved gradually.

He concluded by mentioning that reform of the exchange rate was to be carried out in tandem with the reform of state-owned enterprises (SOEs) and clearance of non-performing assets (NPAs) and conversion of state-owned commercial bank operational mechanism.



29th Sapru House Lecture by H.E. Mr. Ivica Dačić, First Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Serbia on "Serbia in the region, Europe and the World" 3 May 2018



The 29th Sapru House Lecture was delivered by H.E. Mr. Ivica Dacic, First Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Serbia on "Serbia in the region, Europe and the World", on 3 May, 2018. The session was chaired by Ambassador Nalin Surie, Director General, Indian Council of World Affairs.

While discussing the security and political challenges that Republic of Serbia faces, Mr. Dacic said that its key foreign policy priorities can be understood as preservation of its territorial integrity and sovereignty, continuation of negotiations for full membership of EU, strict adherence to the

policy of military neutrality, and maintaining relations with its new and traditional partners. In the context of Serbia's regional participation, he said that Serbia is very active in strengthening cooperation and connectivity with its regional partners. Serbia was in favour of creating a single Balkan market to facilitate foreign investments and boost economic development. He added that development is the most important pre-condition for progress and better future, not only for Serbia but for the entire region.

On India-Serbia relations, Mr. Dacic said, that India and Serbia enjoy a close and historic relationship. Indian literature, culture, yoga etc are famous in Serbia. He referred to Rabindranath Tagore's visit to Belgrade and that the Indian texts Ramayana and Mahabharata were part of the Serbian curriculum. He said India and Serbia have been committed partners since the establishment of their relations. Serbia had eased visa norms for India since September 2017. It had abolished visas for visiting Indian nationals, while



India has extended e-visa facility to Serbian nationals. Serbia can learn a lot from initiatives such as Make in India, Start Up India, Smart Cities and Skill India. He said several Indian companies have invested in the areas of information technology, agricultural machinery and vehicles. Indian firms can take advantage of the Free Trade Agreement (FTA) Serbia has with Russia, Ukraine, Azerbaijan, Armenia, Kazakhstan and Turkey.

Increasing economic activities was in the interest of both countries. Mr. Dacic concluded by quoting Rabindranath Tagore, "Civilisation must be judged and prized, not by the amount of power it has developed, but by how much it has evolved and given expression to by its laws and institutions, the love of humanity".



13th Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) Forum Meeting Astana, Kazakhstan 4-5 May, 2018



The Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, has mandated ICWA to be the nodal Think Tank for representing India at the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) Forum meetings.

The 13th SCO Forum meeting was held at Astana, Kazakhstan, on 4-5 May 2018. A six-member ICWA delegation, led by Ambassador P. S. Raghavan, participated in the Forum meeting.

It was the first Forum meeting after India's formal admission to SCO as a full member. There were five thematic plenary sessions and the presentations by the participants were on wide range of subjects. The participants welcomed India's inclusion in the SCO.

Ambassador P S Raghavan, Leader of the Indian Delegation; Mr. Ajaneesh Kumar, DDG, ICWA; and Dr. Sanjeev Kumar, Dr. Athar Zafar & Dr. Indrani Talukdar, Research Fellows, ICWA, presented views on India's engagement with the SCO, and how India and the Organization can benefit from each other particularly in economy, security and connectivity spheres.



First Bilateral Seminar with The Alexandre de Gusmao Foundation (FUNAG), Brazil on "Brazil-India: 70 years of Diplomatic Relations", Brazil, 16-17 May, 2018



The First ICWA-FUNAG bilateral seminar on the theme '70 Years of Diplomatic Relations between India and Brazil' was held in Brasilia, Brazil (16-17 May 2018). FUNAG is the MoU partner institution from Brazil. The ICWA delegation was led by Ambassador Nalin Surie (Director General, ICWA) and comprised of five participants. Prof. Abdul Nafey (JNU), Dr. Nitya Nanda (TERI), Mr. Pranav Kumar (CII), Mr. Ajaneesh Kumar (DDG, ICWA) and Dr. Stuti Banerjee, (RF, ICWA). The participants from Brazil were identified by FUNAG and comprised scholars who have expertise in India studies. The seminar was a two day event and began with a lecture series that looked at seventy years of diplomatic relations. Thereafter, over three sessions the two sides deliberated and presented their views on the pertinent issues of food and energy security, ways to enhance trade and investment relations between the two nations and the partnership they can build in the global governance system of the 21st Century.

The Second ICWA-LAC International Conference on the theme "India and Latin America & the Caribbean: Strengthening the Partnership" was held in Brasilia, Brazil (18 May 2018). The ICWA delegation was led by Ambassador Nalin Surie (Director General, ICWA) and comprised of five participants, Prof. Abdul Nafey (JNU), Dr. Nitya Nanda (TERI), Mr. Pranav Kumar (CII), Mr. Ajaneesh Kumar (DDG, ICWA) and Dr. Stuti Banerjee, (RF, ICWA). Six scholars from Latin America and the Caribbean region participated in the conference. They were from Brazil (Dr. Ana Flavia Barros-Plataiu, Professor of International Relations, University of Brasilia), the Dominican Republic (Ms. Stephanie Rodríguez, FUNGLODE), Ecuador (Prof. Santiago Javier Garcia Alvarez, Central University of Ecuador), Mexico (Ambassador (Rtd.) Eduardo Roldan, COMEXI), Peru (Dr. Sebastien Adins. Professor, Pontificia Universidad Católica del Perú) and Suriname (Dr. Riad J. Nurmohamad). The Conference was a one day event over three sessions. In the working sessions the scholars deliberated and presented their views on the thematic issues to take the relations between India and the countries of the Latin America and Caribbean region forward in the future. Deliberations were made on areas of cooperation, which included trade and investment relations and the partnership they can build in specific areas viz. sustainable development, renewable energy, forest rights, telecommunication and space technology.



ICWA-IFANS Bilateral Dialogue, at Seoul, Korea, 28 May, 2018.



Ambassador Nalin Surie, Director General, Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA), led a five-member delegation to Seoul on May 29, 2018 to participate in the 3rd ICWA-KNDA/IFANS-bilateral dialogue on "Opening a New Chapter in ROK-India Relationship". The delegation consisted of Ambassador V. S. Seshadri, Senior Advisor, Confederation of Indian Industry, New Delhi; Ambassador Skand R. Tayal, former ambassador of India to ROK; Dr. Sanjeev Kumar and Dr. Jojin V. John, Research Fellows, ICWA. Indian embassy was represented by Ambassador Vikram Doraiswami, Indian Ambassador to Republic of Korea, Mr. Satish Sivan, Deputy Chief of Mission and Mr. Ramkumar C., First Secretary (Pol.& Culture). The bilateral 1.5 dialogue was held as per the provisions of "India-Republic of Korea Joint Statement for Special Strategic Partnership" signed during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Republic of Korea in May 2015. The bilateral dialogue was divided into the following three sessions; security and stability of Korean Peninsula and Indo-Pacific region, bilateral economic cooperation and regional economic architecture and towards the Successful Korea-India Summit 2018. The bilateral dialogue between ICWA and KNDA/IFANS was referred to as an important exercise just before South Korean President Moon Jae-in's forthcoming visit to India in July 2018.

In Seoul, the delegation led by DG, ICWA also had separate meetings with Ambassador Enna Park, Ambassador, Public Diplomacy, ROK, Indian Chamber of Commerce in Korea, East Asia Institute and Sejong Institute, during this visit.

Talk by Mr. Jean-Pierre Lacroix United Nations Under Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations Sapru House, New Delhi, 28 June, 2018.



Mr. Jean-Pierre Lacroix, United Nations Under Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations visited the Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA) and delivered a talk on the topic, "The current state of UN Peacekeeping and the way forward". The talk was chaired by Ambassador Nalin Surie, Director General, ICWA and attended by distinguished guests, diplomats, researchers and media-persons.

Mr. Jean-Pierre Lacroix in his presentation highlighted the importance of India in UNPKO, the challenges faced by United Nations Peace Keeping (UNPK) and the response to these

challenges. He recognized India as a major country not only in terms of largest troop contribution but also as a major stakeholder in UNPK. Mr. Lacroix identified several challenges faced by UNPK including lack of progress in most of the political processes which UNPK supports; increasingly dangerous environment for peace-keepers to work and operate; increasingly difficult logistical environment and such others.

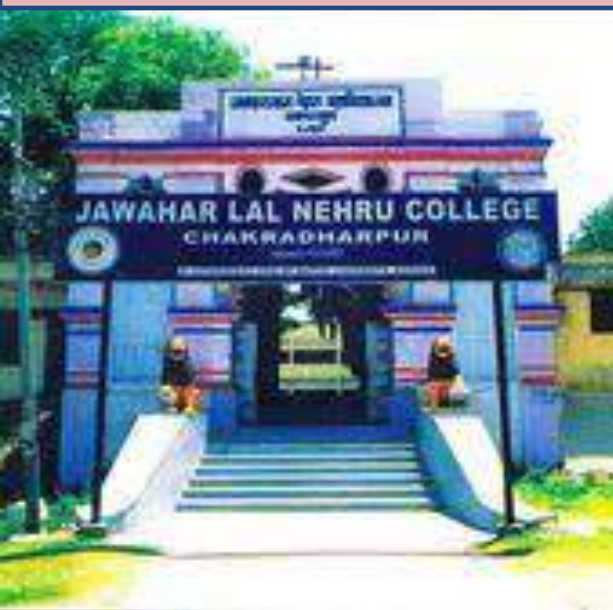
In order to overcome these challenges, Mr. Lacroix underlined certain solutions including sharing with member-states the same understanding of the challenges; upgrading equipment with new technologies; systematic and strategic review of missions led by independent professionals; reform undertaken at the UN Head Quarters, particularly in management and peace and security architecture and; increased support of member-states in peace-keeping.
