ICWA-SIS Dialogue 2014

**“India in the Emerging Global Order:
Political, Strategic and Economic Dynamics”**

(10-12 November 2014)

The phenomenon of emerging countries and their influence on the international system has generated debates globally because of their impact on the global political economy, and power dynamics. Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA) and the School of International Studies (SIS), Jawaharlal Nehru University will be hosting the second Annual Dialogue 2014 to discuss the new developing relationships and the priorities and compulsions of newly emergent countries such as India (amongst others) and their strategic, economic, energy, environment and technological requirements. The Dialogue is an initiative to deliberate upon the place and role of India in the emerging global order and its strategic alignment and realignment with global and regional players including other emerging/rising powers.

This year’s dialogue is titled “India in the Emerging Global Order: Political, Strategic and Economic Dynamics”, and seeks to stimulate public awareness of key issues concerning the rise of Asia, emerging power centres, strategic and power shifts and realignments. The debate on emerging world order denotes the nature of the post Cold War era, and the accompanying changes in the economic, strategic and military polarity in the international system.

This dialogue will be inaugurated at Sapru House on 10 November 2014 and academic sessions will be held at SIS, JNU on 11-12 November 2014. Shri Sitaram Yechury,

Hon'ble Member of Parliament (RS) and Vice President of Governing Council of ICWA, Shri B.P. Singh, IAS(Retd.), Former Governor of Sikkim, and Dr. C. Raja Mohan, Eminent Strategic Thinker, will share their views and reminiscences during the Inaugural Session.

The 2014 Dialogue broadly covers a range of salient themes, such as: India and the Major Powers; India and Regional Groupings; India and Emerging Powers; Strategic and Security Aspects; Environment and Other Resources and Energy Security.

The ICWA and SIS have their links, spanning several decades with the Sapru House. To bolster their ties and initiate productive academic engagement the two institutions will continue to host similar events in the future.
