(22-23 September, 2016 at Moscow)

The Inaugural Session was graced by the Mr. Sergei Glazeyev, Aide to the President Vladimir Putin, Mr. I.V. Morgulov, Deputy Foreign Minister and Mr. Anatoly Torkunov, Chancellor, MGIMO. The Indian side was represented by Ambassador Pankaj Saran and Ambassador Nalin Surie, DG, ICWA.

The deliberations, which were free and frank, were primarily based on the following five themes:

- The Fourth Industrial Revolution in the West: Directions and Problems
- Russian and Indian Relations: Present and Future
- Regional Integration and Transport Corridors in Eurasia
- Afghanistan, SCO, the Issues of Terrorism and Stability in Central Asia
- The Role of Russia in Asia (Including the Role of China and the Situation in the Asia-pacific Region)
- The Future of the Arctic Region

The interactions addressed points of concerns and opportunities for the future to strengthen the existing bilateral relationship between India and Russia in all dimensions: politically, economically and culturally. Both sides took note of each other's views, opinions and analyses on all the five thematic issues. The meeting concluded with a broad agreement to continue the exchange at the next round to be held in India in the following year.
